She also coordinates the Postdoctoral PFF Specialized Studies Program and the Postdoctoral PFP Specialized Studies Program. In support of the PFF and PFP programs, Devine provides professional development workshops throughout the calendar year. Prior to serving in the FSU Graduate School, Devine worked in the University of Tennessee Office of the Provost overseeing a statewide desegregation program for Tennessee colleges and universities and coordinating both a Handbook for High School Counselors and six statewide conferences for counselors.
